
Would you say that immigration helps the United States more than it hurts it, OR immigration hurts the United States more than it helps it?



How much of an impact has illegal immigration made on your own community where you live--a great deal of impact, quite a bit of impact, just a little impact, or no impact at all?




Do you favor or oppose a new Arizona Law that requires police who stop a person to question that persons immigration status if there is a reasonable suspicion that he or she is in the country illegally






Would you favor building a 700 mile long fence on the border with Mexico






Would you favor imposing fines of tens of thousands of dollars on employers who hire illegal immigrants



Would you favor sending employers who hire illegal immigrants to jail.




Would you favor putting more Border Patrol Officers on the U.S. border with Mexico



Would you favor creating an ID card issued by the federal government that all U.S. citizens and legal immigrants would be required to show to show to an employer when applying for a job








Do You Support or Oppose Congress Passing Comprehensive Immigration Reform?




Do You Support or Oppose passing Comprehensive Immigration Reform (All Voters)




Do You Want your State to Pass A Similar Immigration Law to Arizona's?




Do you Think that Plans to Boycott Arizona are a Good Idea?




